As you know, the Will of Oliver M. Wallop contained a Conservation Easement in favor of the Nature Conservancy. That easement exempted 4 tracts of 5 acres each and provided as follows:

Use only two (2) of the four (4) Tracts reserved for construction of additional residential dwellings and associated outbuildings, said two (2) Tracts to be selected by Testator's devisees of the lands subject to the Conservation Easement given their heirs, successors or assigns at their sole election within one hundred eighty (180) days of the date of Testator's death; and

Enclosed is a map of the Wallop property which depicts the Conservation Easement and the four five acre parcels. Pursuant to the above quoted language, you are hereby notified that the Wallop heirs have selected the tract in the southeast quarter of Section 30 marked tract 3 and the tract in the northeast quarter northwest quarter of Section 31, marked tract 2. The tract numbers correspond to the tract numbers on page 4 and 5 of the Will Codicil.
